EMERGENCY OVERVIEW

Appearance: white to light yellow powder.

Caution! May cause eye, skin, and respiratory tract irritation. May be harmful if swallowed. Light sensitive. Moisture sensitive.

Target Organs: None.

Potential Health Effects

Eye: Dust may cause mechanical irritation. Low hazard for normal industrial handling.

Skin: Dust may cause mechanical irritation. Low hazard for usual industrial handling.

Ingestion: May cause irritation of the digestive tract.

Inhalation: No hazard expected in normal industrial use. Dust is irritating to the

respiratory tract.

Chronic: Not available. Prolonged or repeated contact may result in "vanillism", an allergic dermatitis. Doesn't seem likely upon a closer look since the allergic reaction is caused by a mite in the 'raw' vanilla.

Section 4 - First Aid Measures

Eyes: Flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes, occasionally lifting the upper and lower eyelids. Get medical aid.

Skin: Get medical aid if irritation develops or persists. Wash clothing before reuse. Flush skin with plenty of soap and water.

Ingestion: If victim is conscious and alert, give 2-4 cupfuls of milk or water. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Treat symptomatically and supportively. Get medical aid if irritation or symptoms occur.

Inhalation: Remove from exposure and move to fresh air immediately. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. Get medical aid if cough or other symptoms appear.

Notes to Physician: Treat symptomatically and supportively.

Section 5 - Fire Fighting Measures
